One Year Ago

March 29, 2012

In a 3-1 vote, city council approved the construction of a three-bay box hangar at the Grant Municipal Airport during their regular meeting. March 28, 1963

Kenneth Drake, a 26-year-old transport driver for the Elsie Coop Oil Co. received minor injuries when he laid a fully loaded, 60,000 pound semi-trailer transport onto its side. The accident occurred Friday at around 3:15 in the afternoon. The drivers comments were, “I know it can happen to anyone, no matter how careful he tries to be.”

Seventy Five Years Ago

March 31, 1938

A great crowd attended the dedication services for Ogallala’s new post office building and the city welcomed the guests in a big way. Area postmasters enjoyed a banquet, then the flag was raised and the “laying of the cornerstone” celebration. There was a live band, food and drinks and an excellent crowd.
