This year's starting lineup for the Wildcats include 5-foot-5 senior, Emily Hasenauer (setter), 6-foot senior, Brooke Hochstetler (middle blocker/hitter), 5-foot-9 junior, Katelyn Melton (outside hitter), 5-foot-5 junior, Anna Griffiths (setter), 6-foot junior, Chelsea Sowle (middle blocker/hitter), 5-foot-6 sophomore, Sara Hubbard (outside hitter), and 5-foot-2 freshman, Morgan Messersmith (defensive specialist) rotates in for Hochstetler in the back row. Also slated for a middle blocker starting position is 5-foot-8 freshman, Christina Daniels who didn't suit up on Friday due to an injury.



In the first set the Lady Cats struggled to get something going. Youth and inexperience help feed the Wildcats nervous tension. As the set progressed though, and with some excellent senior leadership from Emily Hasenauer and Brooke Hochstetler, the Wildcats really seemed to settle down, and play with the confidence that the fans have come to expect from their Cats. Offensively, Hochstetler (two aces) led the Cats scoring seven points, followed closely by Melton who scored six points (two aces). Sowle (two aces) and Griffiths (one ace) each had four points, Hubbard had two points, and sophomore Alexandria Lundvall (one ace) had one point.
