The Wallace Wildcats competed in the Wallace Triangular on Tuesday, Oct. 1.

Wallace vs. Brady

The Cats' first opponent was the Brady Eagles. The Lady Wildcats started out a bit timid in the first set, but they stepped it up a bit in the second. Unfortunately, a determined Eagles team battled to win the match in two, 21-25, and 26-28.

Leading the team offensively against the Eagles was senior Alexandria Lundvall (two aces) and junior Mickayla Sheets each with five points, followed closely by senior Sara Hubbard and freshman Maggie May each with (two aces) four points. Junior Morgan Messersmith had two points, and junior Christina Daniels (one ace) had one point.

Leading the team with set assists was Lundvall with 20, followed by Daniels with one. Defensively, Daniels had 10 kills and one block. Hubbard had four kills and one block, junior Hayley Storm had three kills and one block, senior Jaclyn Nelson had two kills, and Sheets had one kill.

Wallace vs. Maywood

The Lady Cats then had to face the Maywood Tigers. The Wildcats won this match in three sets 20-25, 25-7, and 25-13.

Let down a bit by the close loss in the second set to Brady, the Lady Cats came out of the locker room a bit flat. The Tigers took advantage of the deflated Wildcat team and won the first set 20–25.

In striking contrast to the first set, the Cats were ready for the Tigers, taking the early lead in the second. The Tigers made every effort to fight back, but the Cats dominated the second set

Leading the team with set assists was Lundvall with 29, followed by Sheets with two.

Defensively, Daniels led the team with 22 kills and one block. Hubbard had six kills, Storm had three kills, and Sheets had two kills.
