The musical is based on the book by Lawrence Kasha and David Landay. Music and lyrics are by Gene de Paul and Johnny Mercer.

Created in the 1950s, the production features the song, "Bless Yore Beautiful Hide," and a barn-raising brawl.

The eldest brother, Adam, will be portrayed by senior Kye Kurkowski. The "gal for him" is Milly, played by fellow senior Mackenzie Hite.
