“Connect Perkins County” is a newly formed organization to support business growth through mentoring, communication and connections with resources.

The after-hours event next week will take place at 5:30 p.m. at the Perkins County Fairgrounds on the west edge of Grant where participants can enjoy drinks and hors d' oeuvres while listening to an informal presentation by Don Macke.
